END OF TERM MOTIVE

We are thrilled to introduce a new initiative that was introduced at the end of the autumn term in 2022, called the End of Term Motive. This exciting event aims to motivate our students during the final weeks before the end of the academic term, providing them with something to look forward to.

The feedback from our students about the first End of Term Motive has been overwhelmingly positive. Tianna from Year 10 shared, "The first end-of-year motive was amazing; the music and dancing was good," while Kadi, also from Year 10, expressed, "The energy was good with all the year groups." The End of Term Motive consists of two separate events - one for Key Stage 3 (KS3) and one for Key Stage 4 (KS4). These events typically take place on two different afternoons, marking the end of the academic term

To participate in the End of Term Motive, students need to earn 150 "Arena points" during a window period of 3-4 weeks before the end of term. These points are awarded based on the demonstration of ambition, professionalism, and kindness, in alignment with our academy motto. We hope that this requirement encourages positive habits and behaviors among our students throughout the academy.

During the motive, students have the opportunity to change into more comfortable clothes and enjoy the festivities within the academy premises. It's worth mentioning that the idea for the motive was created by three Year 11 students. It's fantastic to see a student-led initiative being embraced by the academy.

During the summer term, 7 students from Oasis Academy Arena had the opportunity to participate in a six-week programme at Jamie's Farm Waterloo. The programme is specifically designed to provide young people with practical learning experiences outside of the traditional classroom setting, while also allowing for reflection and personal development. The weekly activities included a range of tasks such as cooking, gardening, and cleaning out animal pens and composts.

Ross McConnell, the Mental Wellbeing Officer for the Palace for Life Foundation stated "we have seen each student flourish in different ways over this project,



whether it be building up confidence, making new friendships, or learning new skills. Some of our students who experienced life on the farm shared some of their thoughts and feelings about the project."

Drew - 'I've really enjoyed interacting with the animals on the farm and it has been good to see how life on the farm works. The staff on the farm always ask how our day/week has been, and they always listen when you have something to tell them. With Jamie's farm it's helped me feel less lonely, made me feel more confident and out going, and it has helped me worked better in school both before and after going. It's also helped me with thinking about a future career choice.'

Tobias - 'I enjoyed trying new foods that we got to try on the farm. I also loved cleaning out the compost and the animals pens because I felt like I was doing something useful and it was satisfying and enjoyable. I think the farm has helped me to realise what things I enjoy the most.'

MATHS SUMMER CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

Year 7:

During the summer term, students have been learning about Numbers (Prime factor decompositions, Equivalent fractions, and all operations of fractions). Most recently students have been learning about ratios and percentages.

Year 8:

During the summer term, students have been learning about angles (angles between parallel lines, polygons, and bearings. Most recently, students have been learning about areas, volumes, and surface areas. This involved circles, composite shapes, volumes of prisms and composite solids, surface areas of prisms, and composite solids.

Year 9:

During the summer term, students have been learning about geometry (Pythagoras, Trigonometry, and proofs). Most recently students have been learning about finding mean from grouped data, comparing distributions, probability, and cumulative frequency graphs including box plots.

Year 10:

During the summer term, students have been learning about Similarity (compound measures, proportions, similar shapes, Pythagoras' and trigonometry including 3D. Most recently students have been learning about data handling (finding averages, and presenting data including scatter diagrams, histograms, cumulative frequency curves, and box plots.

Sparxmaths: Independent learning platform for Maths homework

All year groups are currently doing their independent learning on Sparxmaths at OAA. Sparxmaths homework is set automatically based individual progress and it is fully differentiated. Emails are being sent to parents automatically if the student has failed to complete the homework on due date.

SPECIALIST AGENCIES THAT WORK WITH OUR SEND DEPARTMENT

Educational Psychologists

Educational psychologists work within local authorities, in partnership with families and other professionals, to help children and young people achieve their full potential. Educational psychologists support schools and the local authority to improve all children's experiences of learning. We recognise that some students may find school difficult and require additional support. We may then refer the student to an Educational Psychologist to try and understand why a particular student is struggling and to recommend strategies that could be employed with the student.

Educational psychologists use their training in psychology and knowledge of child development to assess difficulties children may be having with their learning. They provide specific advice and training on how schools might help children to learn and develop. They recommend methods, or develop strategies in partnership with schools, to help a child learn more effectively. Strategies may include teaching approaches, improvements to learning environments, advice on curriculum materials and behaviour support. Parents are included in the whole process and outcomes.

Mental Health Support Team

We participate in a newly funded government initiative to improve the emotional wellbeing of young people. Oasis now has access to a Mental Health Support Team funded by NHS England, working jointly with the Department of Education. This service aims to promote the early detection and support for issues such as anxiety and low mood. Research shows that if support is offered early, this can prevent escalation of problems later. Students that may be struggling either in school or at home can be referred to this service. We currently have two counsellors with us. They are:

The Education Wellbeing Practitioner

She can offer 8 sessions of guided self-help to support students struggling with anxiety or low mood and give them strategies to manage this in future.

School Counsellor

She can offer 8 counselling sessions to students experiencing difficulties with their emotional wellbeing due to issues such as anxiety, self-esteem, bereavement, stress, and difficulties with relationships, at school or home.

Senior practitioners in our team can also support the school with signposting to support from other services. If you are concerned about your child and would like support from the MHST, please contact our SENCO, and Assistant Principal for Inclusion, Ms. Natalie French, email: Natalie.French@oasisarena.org

Speech and Language Therapy (SALT)

We have speech and language therapists that come into our school to support our students with speech, language and communication needs (SLCN). These therapists enable us to put into place appropriate strategies and deliver targeted language interventions. We offer a range of interventions to support our students such as: the Lego club, Touch Typing, Speech and Language, Zones of regulations as well as offering breakfast in the morning and opportunities to



explore sensory with a gardening club launching in the summer term. The Matrix has its own classrooms, kitchen area, sensory room, and outside playground!
