GEOGRPHY DEPARTMENT

Our Geography classes have been bustling with exciting explorations and knowledge-building activities. Here's a glimpse of what each year group has been up to:

Year 7

In Year 7, our students embarked on a journey to discover the world's continents and lines of latitude. They also delved into concepts like scale, 4 and 6-figure grid-references, distance, and relief, and explored the fascinating physical and human geography of the UK. Next term, students will dive into 'Social and Economic Development,' where they'll explore topics such as development indicators and fair trade.

Year 8

Year 8 students have been on a quest to unravel the mysteries of population and urbanization. This included the study of population distribution, migration, natural increase, and the intriguing world of megacities. As we move into the next half-term, students will explore 'Cold Environments,' focusing on topics like glacial processes and landforms.

Year 9

Year 9 students have been navigating the theme of 'Interconnectedness.' They've dived into intriguing subjects such as the 2010 Icelandic volcanic eruption and how it had a global impact. In the next half-term, students will turn their attention to 'Future Threats,' honing in on challenges like overpopulation and climate change.

Year 10

Year 10 students have been exploring urban issues and challenges in Rio de Janeiro. The next half-term will see them continuing this journey as they shift their focus to London, including the impact of the Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park.

Year 11

Our Year 11 students have been immersing themselves in 'Resource Management,' with a particular emphasis on the significance of water resources worldwide. As we move into the next half-term, they will embark on the fieldwork element of their GCSE, applying their geographical knowledge in practical settings.

SPOTLIGHT ON OUR SEND INTERVENTIONS

We look forward to our new academic year and the start of our new SEND interventions to assist in improving not only the academic potential of our SEND students but also their social skills and emotional well-being, which at our school is important and key to our student's success.

We have included a brief outline of some of our key interventions: Our Vocabulary Groups

WHY VOCABULARY INTERVENTION

Introduction

"Without grammar, very little can be conveyed, without vocabulary, nothing can be conveyed."

- David A. Wilkins (1972)

Vocabulary is important across the curriculum. It is the foundation for comprehension - having the ability to understand what you read and hear and make meaning of is fundamental for the success of every student's education. It helps children to communicate in a more engaging way and gives them the ability to grasp ideas, interpret ideas from others and an opportunity to think logically.

Part of our goal at Arena is to develop our student's literacy level so they can communicate effectively – in both written and oral communication. To achieve this, the school has embedded the teaching of Key vocabulary in our curriculum across all subjects, allowing teachers to teach students the meaning of key vocabulary as part of their lesson.

Vocabulary intervention was introduced to pre-teach key vocabulary in all core subjects - English, Maths and Science, to help our SEND students have a better understanding of unfamiliar words they come across in lessons. This helps them to have a better understanding of the lessons being taught.

HOW THE VOCABULARY IS TAUGHT IN OUR INTERVENTION SESSION

Sessions are run once a week - 20 minutes per session for six weeks. Unlike classroom-based teaching, students learn the meaning of words through game-based activities. Good vocabulary activities encourage more than just memorisation of the definitions of words, it helps them explore synonyms and antonyms and how words are used in their correct context.

Examples of the vocabulary games used in our interventions are:

- · Charades- a student is called to pick and act the word whiles the rest of the students guess the correct word.
- Play a round of Pictionary students draw a picture for each word to create their own visual dictionary. This helps them to develop an association with the word and are able to tap into the word when needed.
- Make a Word Map- students relate the word of the day to other words and concepts they already know.
- Match-Up Words and Definitions- Students are given a card (either a word or a definition), allowing students to circulate in the room and find their match.



At the end of the six weeks, students are assessed through a summative assessment- exam questions to check if they have met their targets - To understand the meaning of vocabulary words and use the words accurately.

Reading Plus

A key intervention that we run is Reading Plus which aims to increase reading fluency, comprehension, stamina and motivation alongside expanding our students' vocabulary. Years 7-9 have 3 sessions a week for 50 minutes, for the whole of the academic year.

Students pick a book based on their interests, read through an extract and answer comprehension questions. They are very eager to find themselves on the leaderboard in the library at the end of each week and this competitiveness fuels them to out 'streak', 'combo' and 'rate gain' each other.

Zones of Regulation

"When little people are overwhelmed by big emotions, it's our job to share our calm, not join their chaos". - I.R Knost

The world overflows with people who cannot name, let alone regulate their emotions. For children, this can be all the more difficult and daunting. 'Zones of Regulation' provides our students with the tools they need in order to identify and cope with their ever-changing, challenging and circumstantial emotions.



Through group discussions, self-reflection tasks and thoughtprovoking videos, we aim to instil in our students that there is no good or bad emotion - only expected or unexpected behaviours that may derive from these, and how we can manage ourselves when certain 'triggers' impact our emotional wellbeing, or 'kick us out of the green zone', as we might say.

Our sessions are run once a week for 30 minutes over a 7week period, culminating in the production of an individualised emotional 'toolkit' that students can take away with them and use to regulate, especially in lessons but also in their everyday lives. Below is a snapshot of the 4 zones of regulation and strategies we use.

Ms. Enache Reading Plus Lead

Lego Club

Our Matrix ELP has been running Lego therapy sessions three times each week, for those students who need help in developing their social; planning; teamwork; communication; collaborative and computational thinking skills. This intervention is targeted at or tailored for students with disorders on the autism spectrum and for those who possess social communication difficulties.

There are usually four students that partake in each session and each student is assigned a specific role to equally contribute to the development, not only of themselves but, of one another.


The roles are Builder; Engineer; Supplier and Director. In each of these roles, there are certain skills that are necessary to be implemented to produce the correct Lego model that is chosen by the Engineer at the beginning of the session.

Some roles are more physically demanding than others; whilst others are more focused on oral engagement. This program runs until the students have done well enough to be discharged.














English as an Additional Language at Oasis Academy Arena
